DISTRICT SURVEY RESPONSES

We recently conducted a community survey as part of our continuous improvement work. The survey was conducted by an independent firm and open to parents, staff and community members. We believe that the people closest to our District know what we are doing well and where we can improve.

The response rate and results were overwhelmingly positive. Typically the firm sees a response rate of about 13%, the KASD survey garnered a response rate of 35%. The District was fortunate to have thousands of community members and staff respond to our survey with strong support of our schools.

Our community believes we are delivering a high-quality educational experience and spending tax dollars wisely. When parents and staff were asked if they would recommend Kimberly Schools to a friend or family member, we ranked in the top 2% of all schools surveyed across the country.

In addition to the positive feedback, areas of improvement were also identified. Parents shared concerns about parent/teacher communication



as well as students' mental health and behavior. We remain committed to our continuous improvement work and will make adjustments based on the feedback received and continuing to provide students with what they need, when they need it.

INCUBATOR PROGRAM PRODUCES WINNING PRODUCT

KHS Students to Appear on Season 7 of Project Pitch It!



Three Kimberly High School students, Riley Schmidt, Kade Dunham, and Ryan Halada, have achieved an impressive feat by landing a spot on Season 7 of Project Pitch

It! Their product, a heated hoodie named Huva, was created as a part of their INCubator class. The team has already made waves by winning a high school entrepreneurship competition at the University of Wisconsin in Oshkosh last spring.

The Kimberly students learned a lot from the competition, particularly what it is like to make a presentation in front of people. They are focusing now on a double pocket for a battery pack that may double as a phone charger.

"We learned from research that you lose most of your heat through your neck area so we came up with the idea because we have all had the problem of walking into school and wearing a hat and then our hair was ruined for the rest of the day," said Riley, a sophomore who serves as marketing officer.

"We came up the idea to add a heated hood because then you stay in style

and you keep all your heat. You are adding heat to the hood so your heat does not leave."

"When we found out we were the winners I was really shocked, but when they were telling us why we won it all made sense: that we were ahead of the game and that we were the first on the market ... which is a big factor why we won," Riley added.

The appearance of Huva on Project Pitch It! is a significant milestone for the team and we wish them the best of luck. 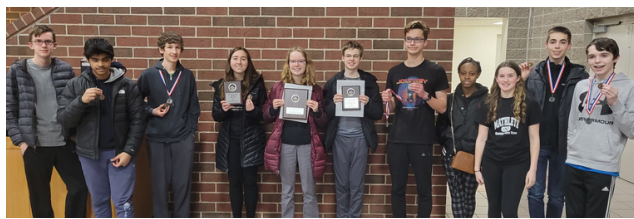

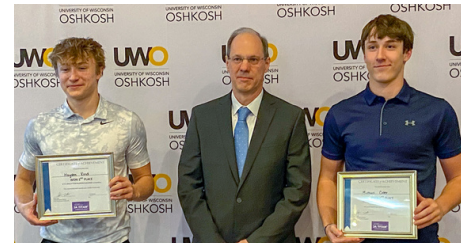
STUDENTS ADVANCE IN THE NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

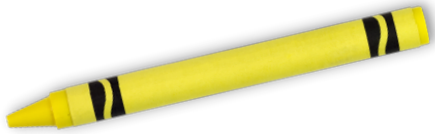
