Top three finishers for Kimberly include Jon Carl who earned 1st Place in the Entrepreneurship Innovation Plan, Mason Lawrenz took 2nd Place in the Accounting Application Series, Paige Schumacker and Ana Rank, as a team with Brynn Malcomson as a substitute, earned 3rd Place for their Financial Literacy Promotion Project and Vienna Melzl earned 3rd Place in Principles of Hospitality/ Tourism.

Fifth place finishers for Kimberly include Carli Lund in the Sports and

The competition involves an exam related to the business concepts and two role plays. Role plays often put students into a scenario where they are an employee or manager and they are presented with a problem they must solve. Students then present their ideas to judges who are acting as the boss. Judges are business professionals from the area. These role plays are a great way for students to practice their soft skills in communication, creativity and decision making. Others will compete by creating research

projects, business prospectuses, and advertising campaigns.

Each March, over 1,000 Wisconsin DECA member/students and their advisors from all over the state attend the State Career Development Conference (SCDC) held in Lake Geneva. Students having excelled at the District level in January have opportunities to compete at SCDC. Those DECA member/students with outstanding results at the SCDC will represent Wisconsin at the International Career Development Conference in Orlando later this spring.
