#### An Update on Your Investment

Kimberly Area School District is a high-achieving, low-spending District and recently the district was allowed to increase its revenue ceiling. For the first time in 10 years inflation and increased operating expenses such as heating, cooling, busing and salaries will cause a rise in the mill rate. Another significant factor driving the tax rate higher is the increase in vouchers. Vouchers have seen a 20% surge, costing taxpayers in the Kimberly Area School District almost \$1 million annually. As a public school district, we strive to provide the best quality education to students while also being responsible stewards of taxpayer funds. Taxpayers' investment in the District helps the next generation prepare for life after graduation and positively impacts home values.

# KIMBERLY HIGH SCHOOL SHINES WITH STATEWIDE ACADEMIC HONOR

Kimberly High School (KHS) is thrilled to announce its exceptional achievement of receiving the Level 1 Advanced Placement (AP) Pacesetter Award from the Wisconsin Advanced Placement Advisory Council (WAPAC) along with the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI). Of the more than 500 public high schools in Wisconsin, KHS is one of only 17 bestowed with the distinguished Level 1 AP Pacesetter Award.

The Advanced Placement program allows students to tackle college-level work while still in high school and, through taking AP exams and courses, students can earn college credit and placement. There is also a financial advantage to earning AP credits while in high school, which helps students and families lessen the costs of higher education.

The Pacesetter Awards are unique to Wisconsin and are earned based on the percentage of students participating in college courses combined with each student's AP Exam scores. To be recognized as a

Pacesetter Level 1 School, more than 30% of students at the school must take AP exams and more than 70% of those test-takers must receive a score of 3 or higher (students must receive a three or above to receive Advanced Placement credit).
