Mapleview Intermediate School - Where Students Grow

“MEET THE TEACHER” DAY & SUPPLY DROP-OFF

This year we will not be holding our traditional in-person “Meet the Teacher” Day as we have in the past. In order to keep everyone safe, we will be using the following format and timeline.

Teachers will call or “Google Meet” with students so that they have the opportunity to meet prior to school starting. Teachers will reach out to schedule these times.

On August 26th, students with last names starting A-N may come to school anytime between 12:00 PM and 6:00 PM to drop supplies off.

On August 27th, students with last names starting O-Z may come to school anytime between 12:00 PM and 6:00 PM to drop supplies off.

Families can enter the main doors on Kimberly Ave or the doors on Maple Street to find their homeroom. For students in grade five, bags labeled with the student's name will be placed outside the student's homeroom in alphabetical order. Students may place their supplies in those bags. For students in grade six, lockers are assigned in alphabetical order by homeroom, students may place their supplies inside their lockers. Locker numbers by homeroom are as follows:

Those families unable to make the drop off date can bring their supplies with them the first day of school.

For those families who ordered School Supply Kits, the kits will be placed outside of the homeroom.

Unfortunately staff will be in professional development sessions in preparation for the beginning of the year and teachers/classrooms will be unavailable for visits.

Beginning of Day Procedures:

The start of the day this year will look a bit different from past years. First, the main entrance will not open until 7:00am, we are not planning to allow students to arrive prior to 7:00am. We are going to strongly recommend to parents that they do not bring their children to Mapleview until 7:20am.

Also new this year is that the main gym doors off of Main Street will open at 7am. Parents may drop their child off at that entrance between 7:00 and 7:30am.

When students arrive prior to 7:20, they will be directed to pre-determined locations, by homeroom, in the commons (6th grade) and the gym (5th grade). Students who eat breakfast at school will have their own specific location to eat in the commons. When they are done eating they will report to their assigned homeroom locations.

Students in 6th grade will be able to use their lockers in the morning, but will be asked to simply drop off their coats and backpacks and report to the appropriate location based on the time of the morning. Students in 5th grade will keep their backpacks and coats with them until 7:20am when they are released to their homerooms and can then use the cubbies.

At 7:20am both entrances on Maple Street will open and be supervised. Students will be allowed to go to their homerooms at 7:20am.

Students who ride the bus will again get off the bus upon arrival at Mapleview only to eat breakfast. All other students will be released from the bus at 7:30am. Students are expected to be in their classroom prepared for the morning routine at 7:35am.

Classroom Procedures:

As a staff, we will always keep in mind the KASD principles of physical distancing, social grouping, and risk mitigation and the role they play in setting up our classrooms.



Students will report to their homeroom teacher each morning for attendance, lunch counts, etc. Students will be placed in cohorts of four within their classroom. Students in a cohort are placed three feet apart from each other and each cohort is six feet apart from each cohort.

Upon entering their homeroom for the first class of the day students will be asked to wash their hands prior to participating in classroom activities. Each homeroom is equipped with a sink, soap and hand towels. Teachers will develop their own cadence for handwashing throughout the day; students will be able to wash their hands when needed. Students will always be able to use hand sanitizer as well, but classroom supplies of hand sanitizer may be limited and students should plan to bring their own if needed.

Learning Procedures:

The first and foremost task for our staff in welcoming students back to Maplevue, other than physical safety, is relationship building. Staff are planning activities designed to get to know

their students personally, make connections and find ways to build a sense of community within their homerooms and classrooms.

In addition, staff are being encouraged to transition students into a routine of learning as soon as possible. We believe this will help support the transition back into the classroom.

Transition Procedures:

When traveling within the building students will transition from class to class with their homeroom and will be organized in order by social group. Students should be aware of their line order and it should remain consistent. Staff will accompany students as they move between classes to ensure they use established line and social group procedures while transitioning.

Lunch/Recess Procedures:

Due to the need to physically distance during the school day, lunch at Mapleview has been greatly expanded. The following schedule has been created:

Team 5D:

10:20-10:40 - Voss/Linzmeier Lunch, Butts/Schommer Recess

10:40-11:00 - Butts/Schommer Lunch, Voss/Linzmeier Recess

Team 5U:

11:00-11:20 - Lutostanski/Cerasoli Lunch, Villers/Sense Recess

11:20-11:40 - Villers/Sense Lunch, Lutostanski/Cerasoli Recess

Team 6D:

11:40-12:00 - Miller/Verbruggen Lunch, Hendrickson/Dagenais Recess

12:00-12:20 - Hendrickson/Dagenais Lunch, Miller/Verbruggen Recess

Team 6U:

12:20-12:40 - Hoffman/Schommer Lunch, Vanderloop/Watson Recess


12:40-1:00 - Vanderloop/Watson Lunch, Hoffman/Schommer Recess

Due to the fact that some classes are eating lunch very early or very late in the school day, snack opportunities in the morning or afternoon will be provided.

As you can see, two homerooms will be eating lunch and two homerooms will be outside for recess at a time, approximately 45 students in each grouping. Students will be able to play games and use the entire playground. We will be asking them to physically distance as much as possible and refrain from contact.



End of Day Procedures:



End of day procedures at Mapleview will remain largely unchanged for the 2020-2021 school year, with one exception.

For students riding the bus, our goal is to have the buses off of school property by 2:50pm so that students may exit the back of school in a safe manner. To that end, buses will arrive at Mapleview at 2:40 and bus students will be dismissed at that time. The goal will be that buses pull out of Mapleview at around 2:45. This may impact student arrival time at home by a few minutes.

The remainder of students will be dismissed at the regular dismissal time of 2:50pm. Every exit to the building will be available for student use. Parents may pick their children in the front of school, on Kimberly Avenue, on Maple Street, on First Street or on Main Street. A map of the school has been provided for your family to make the best decision regarding pick up locations.

Miscellaneous Details:

Face Masks Required at School: All students should arrive on the 1st day of school wearing a face mask. If your student does not have one, a disposable mask will be provided. Each student will also be receiving a face mask from their teacher. Look for these after the 1st day and wash them to be included in your student's face mask rotation. A clean face mask should be used each day.

If your student has a medical exemption to not wear a face mask, please provide a physician letter by the 1st day of school. Please also ask your physician if the student would be permitted to wear a mask for short periods of time when working closely with their teacher.

If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to your school nurse.

Water Bottles: Students are encouraged to bring water bottles to school with them as bubblers in the classroom will be available for filling water bottles but not for students to drink from directly. Please make sure bottles are labeled with the student's name.

Shared Snacks:

In an effort to keep our students safe at school, we will not be allowing birthday treats or other shared snacks this year. Students will be allowed to bring individual snacks for themselves, as they have in the past. We will look for other creative ways to celebrate student birthdays.

Chromebooks:

Students in grade six should bring their chromebooks back to school with them on the first day. Students in grade five and any new student to Mapleview will receive their new chromebook the first day of school. New this year, all students in grades five and six will take their chromebooks home each night and should bring them back fully charged the next day. Classrooms will no longer have charging carts located within.


School Fees





MASK BASICS

- Wearing a mask correctly helps protect others in case you're infected with COVID-19 but don't have symptoms.
- Wash your hands before putting on your mask.
- Put it over your nose and mouth and secure it under your chin.
- Try to fit it snugly against the sides of your face.
- Make sure you can breathe easily.
- It is important to always wash your hands after handling or touching a used mask.
- Masks should be washed after each use.

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS



IF YOUR FAMILY LIVES IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

In a shelter



In a motel or campground due to the lack of an alternative adequate accommodation



In a car, park, abandoned building, or bus or train station



Doubled up with other people due to loss of housing or economic hardship

Your school-age children may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act.

Your eligible children have the right to:

- Receive a free, appropriate public education.
 - Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.
 - Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.
 - Enroll in the local school; or continue attending their school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is your preference.
- * If the school district believes that the school you select is not in the best interest of your children, then the district must provide you with a written explanation of its position and inform you of your right to appeal its decision.
- Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if you request this.
 - Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to your children's needs.

If you believe your children may be eligible, contact the local liaison to find out what services and supports may be available. There also may be supports available for your preschool-age children.
