This looks very different from kindergarten to 4th grade, but we feel that if students get used to starting any project or task with the end in mind AND are able to assess their progress accurately in elementary school; they will be well on their way to being a successful adult someday! This is just another step towards our district vision of our students becoming independent problem solvers. Our staff have seen amazing progress in this area up to this point and we hope parents are seeing growth at home as well.

WESTSIDE KIDS HEART CHALLENGE (KHC)

(Supporting The American Heart Association)

Hello Westside Families,

Finally, after a two year hiatus for Westside, Kids Heart Challenge is back with fun, new Heart Heroes who will help take your child/ren on adventures across the globe. Our goal this year is to "Be the Torch" lighting the mission of hope in the fight against heart disease and stroke.

Finn's Mission is back to help kids with special hearts and teach 1.8 million families across the country to learn the lifesaving skill of Hands Only CPR. Why 1.8 million? Because Finn, our survivor and true Heart Hero, has already had 18 procedures in his young life. We need your help to accomplish this, please register your child/ren up online and begin Finn's challenge as a family.

Our Event will be held February 14th. I am super excited to be back supporting The American Heart Association and bringing information to the students about how they can take care of their own hearts and bodies. My father had a heart attack just a few weeks before our school's Kids Heart Challenge Event in 2013. Heart disease is the Number 1 killer in the United States, and it definitely has affected my family, unfortunately, too many times.

The Kids Heart Challenge is full of daily and weekly challenges, school challenges, classroom challenges, and a lot of information about taking care of one's heart. When we return to school on January 2nd, please start looking for daily/weekly challenges that will come home with your child/ren. My hope is to get all of our Westside families to participate in the challenges, and/or the fundraising.

Your child/ren is bringing home a registration form for our Kids Heart Challenge today. You can **register your child online**, which is relatively easy. All the information is located on the form. Start by going to **heart.org/KHC**. Your child/ren can choose to participate in the online challenges and collect donations online as well. Anything online will automatically be sent to me, so I can hand out the fun incentive gifts. All donations online are tracked for me, therefore, no cash or checks need to be brought to school. However, if your child would prefer to bring in cash/checks (written to **The American Heart Association**), that is fine. I keep track of it all.

There are many little Thank You gifts depending on the amount of donations your child/ren raises. I will have the heart hero clips and the wristbands available at school immediately, however, the jump ropes, t-shirts, balls, socks and fitness watches will

have to be ordered. Therefore, please do not expect those items until after our challenge is completed. I will order everything after our collection due date.

Important things to remember:

- 1. Dec. 19th: Our Kids Heart Challenge Kick-Off begins
- 2. Register your child: heart.org/KHC Register with Westside Elementary
- 3. Please check out Finn's Hands-Only CPR Mission Bonus (Online Only)
- 4. All Cash/Checks are due no later than JANUARY 31st. If raising money online, donations can continue to be collected until February 14th.
- 5. Checks made payable to The American Heart Association.
- 6. All Thank You gifts other than the clips/wristbands and bonus mystery gifts will be ordered and delivered in February.
- 7. Our School Event will be held on February 14th during Physical Education classes. Kindergarten will hold their event either Feb. 13th or 15th.
- 8. **The fundraising is completely optional**, your child/ren will/can still participate in all challenges even if they do not participate in the fundraising. However, they do need to be registered online for some of the challenges.
- 9. Any student who raises any amount of money will receive a free voucher to attend a Green Bay Gambler game the weekend of March 25th.
- 10. Any student who raises at least \$100 will get to participate in a Pie Toss event in February.
- 11. The Top fundraising student will have the gym named after them for the remainder of the school year.
- 12. There will be other fun events planned for the Top Class and Top Pod. Stay Tuned.



- 1. Complete the required forms online at http://www.kimberly.k12.wi.us/parents/registration
 - If you do not have computer access, computers will be available at any of KASD's schools or the District office.
 - If you are unable to stop in during normal business hours, please contact the school secretary to set up a time to stop in.
- Birthdates are confirmed through the Wisconsin Immunization Registry. For non-immunized students or students registering from out of state, an ORIGINAL birth certificate must be brought in at some point after you have registered online. The birth certificate can be brought to any of the schools listed on the right or KASD's District Office.

The Kimberly Area School District takes a nurturing approach to 4K and 5K development. It is expected, as with all grades, that students will be ready for the next grade level at the end of the school year.



COVID-19 STRATEGIES FOR EVERYDAY OPERATIONS

Kimberly Area School District is taking a variety of actions every day to prevent the spread of infectious diseases, including the virus that causes COVID-19. From the start of the pandemic new tools have become available to limit the effect of COVID-19 on communities and healthcare systems. As a result the CDC and Wisconsin Department of Public Health Services have shifted their COVID response.

KASD is adopting the COVID Strategies listed below, which are supported by our local public health department. These strategies may be revised depending on updated information and guidance from the CDC and Wisconsin Department of Public Health Service.
