Post-Book Fair Frequently Asked Questions

Can parents use unspent e-wallets at our virtual fair website? Our in-person fairs are picked up the morning of Wednesday, Nov 17, so they will start being packed up the afternoon of Tuesday, November 16.. Any eWallets with remaining balances leftover after your in-person Fair can be used to shop at your school's Virtual Fair till 11/21/21. After 11/21/21, the eWallet will automatically convert to an eGift card.

My unspent eWallet funds have not been returned to my credit card. eWallet funds are not returned to a credit card. After the Book Fair, the funds become a gift card balance and can be used to shop online with Scholastic or to fund an eWallet for a future Book Fair. The funds do not expire and are not tied to a specific school or student.

Once an eWallet is created, where can details be viewed? Log in to your MyScholastic account to view, manage, or print an existing eWallet.

What happens if I forget about the remaining funds on my child's eWallet after the Fair ends?

Whomever created the eWallet will receive a monthly email reminder of their Scholastic balance to ensure it is not forgotten. The funds become an eGift card balance and can be used throughout Scholastic online or to fund an eWallet for a future Book Fair.

Could the eWallet funds be transferable to another school if the child changes schools or graduates and still has not used all of the money? At the end of the Fair, the balance is moved to an eGift card

balance. It is not tied to a specific school or student when it becomes an eGift balance; it's only tied to the email address used to create the eWallet. It never expires, can be used for any student, and can be used within any of the Scholastic online sites.

Do eWallet funds expire? eWallet funds never expire and can be used to shop online with Scholastic or to fund an eWallet for a future Book Fair. When our school has their next fair, the eGift card can be used to fund the next eWallet. The funds always follow the email associated with the eWallet or eGift Card. So it's important to use the same email when an eWallet gets created for the next book fair.

I tried to place an order at the Scholastic Store Online, but did not see an option to use my eWallet balance during checkout. What should I do? Be sure to log in with the same email account you used for eWallet setup. During the Book Fair, balances will display as an eWallet during checkout. After the Fair ends, any balances are shown as a gift card balance at checkout.

COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

When monitoring for COVID-19 symptoms, parents/guardians and students should look for:

<u>Major symptoms</u> (Students should stay home and take a COVID-19 test if ONE symptom from this list is present): Fever (above 100.4), cough (above baseline), new loss of taste/smell, trouble breathing/shortness of breath

<u>Minor symptoms</u> (Students should stay home and take a COVID-19 test if TWO symptoms from this list are present): Congestion/runny nose (above baseline), chills, nausea/vomiting, diarrhea, headache (above baseline), body aches, unusual fatigue, sore throat (above baseline)



Keep your child home when:

- They are sick
- They are diagnosed with COVID-19
- They are being tested for COVID-19

COVID protocols vary on a case-by-case basis, but are based on CDC/Wisconsin DHS guidelines. Generally however, protocols will be:

IF MY CHILD	AND IS	THEN HE/SHE/THEY SHOULD
Tests positive for COVID-19	Unvaccinated or vaccinated	Quarantine for 10 days from symptom onset or positive test result
Has COVID-19 symptoms	Unvaccinated	 Stay home Take a COVID-19 test Stay home while awaiting test results Return to school with a negative result Begin 10 day quarantine with a positive result (or if do not test)
Has COVID-19 symptoms	Vaccinated	 Follow typical illness protocol, stay home until 24 hours fever free COVID-19 test encouraged
Is a close contact to a positive case at school and is masked	Unvaccinated or vaccinated	Remain in school and monitor for symptoms
Is a close contact to a positive case	Unvaccinated	 Quarantine for 10 days after last close contact without testing, or Quarantine 7 days after last close contact, with a negative test result collected on day 6 or 7 (provide a copy of the test result to the school)
Is a close contact to a positive case	Vaccinated	Remain in school and monitor for symptoms
Is a close contact and had COVID-19 in last 90 days	Unvaccinated or vaccinated	Remain in school and monitor for symptoms



INFORMATION FOR PARENTS



IF YOUR FAMILY LIVES IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

In a shelter



In a motel or campground due to the lack of an alternative adequate accommodation

In a car, park, abandoned building, or bus or train station



Your school-age children may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act.

Your eligible children have the right to:

- Receive a free, appropriate public education.
- Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.
- Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.
- Enroll in the local school; or continue attending their school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is your preference.
 - * If the school district believes that the school you select is not in the best interest of your children, then the district must provide you with a written explanation of its position and inform you of your right to appeal its decision.
- Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if you request this.
- Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to your children's needs.

If you believe your children may be eligible, contact the local liaison to find out what services and supports may be available. There also may be supports available for your preschool-age children.
