



Winter is right around the corner. If weather conditions dictate that there will be no school or a delayed start, a decision to keep the schools closed is usually made by 6:00 a.m. Parents with students in school receive a direct call, text and/or email from our auto-call system through Infinite Campus since that is the fastest way to communicate with thousands of parents at one time.

As a reminder: If you have a new phone number or email address, please update your information in the Infinite Campus parent portal or contact your school's secretary to update the portal. Also, weather alerts go out using the "General Notification" make sure you have the "General" box checked when verifying your Infinite Campus notifications.

Announcements are also sent to local T.V. and radio stations, please tune to local stations such as these rather than call the school directly: WAPL-105.7FM, WIXX-101.1FM, WHBY-103.5FM, WKFX-104.9FM, WEMI-91.9 FM, WTAQ-97.5FM/1360AM, WWWX-96.9FM and WGEE-93.5FM; and WBAY-TV2, WFRV-TV5, WGBA-TV26, and WLUK-FOX11. If other school events, such as concerts or sporting events are also cancelled because of weather, they are typically communicated through these stations as well.

The District's website and Facebook page are not our primary way to communicate school closures, so we ask parents to listen to the auto-call messages or tune in to the radio and T.V. stations listed for the timeliest updates.





















SCHOOL FEES AND LUNCH PAYMENTS



Just a reminder that you are able to pay school fees and add money to your lunch account online through Infinite Campus. You are now able to pay fees and add money to your lunch account at anytime during the year without being charged the \$1.75 by using the **e-check method**. You will still be charged \$1.75 if you choose to use a credit card to recoup some of the credit card fees that the district is charged. Please remember when you use an e-check it is similar to using a paper check and if this check would be rejected by your bank due to non-sufficient funds, you will be charged a \$25 NSF fee.

REMINDERS

YEARBOOKS: Many of you have already paid for a 2020-2021 Westside Elementary Yearbook! If you haven't had a chance to order and pay for a yearbook, please go online to your Infinite Campus portal and make the \$11.00 payment, OR, send the \$11.00 payment to the office in an envelope clearly marked with your child's name and "yearbook". If you are unsure if you ordered a yearbook, please check your account on Infinite Campus, OR, give us a call. We will not receive the yearbooks until the end of the school year. Also, yearbooks are optional!

MEDICATION AT SCHOOL (including Cough Drops): ALL medication MUST come to school in the original container and be accompanied by the required Medication Form (found on our website or in the office). This includes BOTH prescription medication and over-the-counter medications such as, Cough Drops, Tylenol, Cough Syrup, etc. A physician AND parent signature are required for prescription medication. A parent signature is required for over-the-counter meds. If you have any questions regarding medications, please contact our office—920-739-3578.



















WHEN TO STAY HOME FROM SCHOOL

Keep your child home when:







They are a <u>close contact</u> of someone with COVID-19



Frequently Asked Questions:

Do I keep my child home if someone in my household is being tested for COVID-19?

A: Send your child to school if your child is symptom free.

OR

A: Keep your child home if your child has COVID-like symptoms.

Do I keep my child home from school if someone in my household is a close contact of a confirmed case of COVID-19?

A: Send your child to school if the household member who is the close contact is symptom free.

ΩR

A: Keep your child home if the household member who is the close contact has COVID-like symptoms. (The household member who is the close contact is considered a probable case of COVID if he/she is showing symptoms while awaiting test results and everyone in your household at that point is considered a close contact and will need to quarantine.)

STUDENT ILLNESS GUIDE AND WHEN TO GET TESTED

People with the below symptoms or combination of symptoms may have COVID-19. The table below outlines WI-DHS recommendations of who should receive COVID-19 testing in Wisconsin. If you have these symptoms, **stay home, call your school office and get tested.**

Box A (any <u>one</u> symptom present)						
☐ Cough (above baseline) ☐ Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing ☐ New loss of taste or smell

Box B (any <u>two</u> symptoms present)						
☐ Congestion or runny nose (above baseline) ☐ Chills or fever (100.4) ☐ Nausea or vomiting						
☐ Diarrhea ☐ Fatigue ☐ Muscle or body aches ☐ Sore throat (above baseline						
*If you choose not to get tested, you must remain home until at least 10 days have passed since symptom onset AND at least 24 hours have passed since resolution of fever without use of medicine AND other symptoms have improved.

☐ I am a close contact of someone with COVID-19						
WI-DHS recommends getting tested if you are a close contact. If you test negative during your quarantine period, you will still need to complete your full 14-day quarantine before it is safe to go back to school or be around others						

For all other illnesses, follow typical school illness protocol by staying home, calling the school office and once symptoms have improved and your child is fever free for 24 hours they may return.

CLOSE CONTACT GUIDE

What does it mean to be a close contact of someone with COVID-19?

You are a "close contact" if any of the following situations happened while you spent time with the person with COVID-19, even if they didn't' have symptoms:



Had direct physical contact with the person (for example, a hug, kiss, or handshake)




Were within 6 feet of the person for more than 15 minutes



Had contact with the person's respiratory secretions (for example, coughed or sneezed on; contact with dirty tissue; shared a drinking glass, food, towels, or other personal items)



Live with the person or stayed overnight for at least one night in a household with the person



EXAMPLE

Your child was playing outside with a neighborhood friend when he drank from the friend's water bottle without thinking. The following day, the friend developed symptoms and subsequently tested positive for COVID-19. **Your child is a close contact.**

EXAMPLE

I went out to eat with a friend yesterday and we were within 6 feet of each other for 30 minutes. The following day my friend tested positive for COVID-19. I am now a close contact. What about my child? **Your child is NOT a close contact** as your child did not spend time with your friend.

If you had contact with someone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 you may be at risk of infection. Follow these recommendations for 14 days since your last close contact with someone with COVID-19. It is important to **self-quarantine and self-monitor** to protect yourself, your family, and your community.



As a close contact, what does it mean to quarantine?





- Avoid travel
- Go out only if absolutely necessary
- Postpone all non-essential medical appointments until your guarantine is over
- Do not use public transportation, ride-sharing, or taxis
- Wear a face cover when you are around others
