NOTES FROM THE OFFICE

CALLING YOUR CHILD IN SICK

When you call your child in sick, please indicate to the office why you are calling him/her in. In the case of strep throat, chicken pox, pink eye or any other contagious illness, a letter will be sent to each child in the class, after two cases have been reported, indicating that a classmate has been exposed.

BUS RIDING

If you want your child(ren) to ride another student's bus, please be aware that only bus students can ride a bus. This is an insurance issue with Lamers Bus Lines and there will be no exceptions. A written note from both parents involved must accompany all requests to ride another student's bus.



AFTER SCHOOL PICK-UP

As we continually strive to keep our students as safe as possible, we ask that all students and parents picking up students, exit the front of the building after school. Please refrain from picking up students on the north side of the building (near the 5K playground), as this can create unsafe situations with children running in between cars. Thanks for helping keep our kids safe!


PICTURE RE-TAKE DAY - SEPTEMBER 26TH

BACK-TO-SCHOOL SAFETY



Now that school is back in session, please remember to drive safely around pedestrians, school buses and bicyclists, and to provide children with the necessary knowledge to stay safe on their way to school and while at school. POLICY ON STUDENT ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL EVENTS

Just a reminder: All students attending Kimberly Pa-permaker football games or any other school event need to be accompanied by a parent/guardian, per the following district policy.



Policy 5855

The Board of Education encourages students to attend as many school events held after school as possible, without interfering with their schoolwork and home activities. Enthusiastic spectators help to build school spirit and encourage those students who are participating in the event.

However, in order to ensure that students attending as non-participants are properly safeguarded, the Board requires that all elementary and pre-high school students be accompanied by a parent or adult chaperone when they arrive at the event and throughout its duration. The Board will not be responsible for a student(s) if they attend without an adult chaperone.

The Board will continue to provide adequate supervision for all students who are participants in District-sponsored events.

We require all students to be seated and have designated seating areas for middle school students. We are expecting all elementary and intermediate school students to enter with an adult chaperone. If they are not seated with the adult chaperone they will be seated in the middle section as space permits.

A book swap is an event where students bring in a used book to donate and they get to take a “new to them” book home to keep. 
SINGING GAMES & FOLK DANCE FAMILY EVENT - OCT. 19TH

WOODLAND ELEMENTARY PBIS KICK-OFF EVENT

On Friday, September 7th, Woodland Elementary School held our Woodland Way Kick-Off for the 2018-2019 school year! This year, our theme is "Road Trip" and we had a great event to kick this off. As we travel through the school year students will be reminded of our four community values; honesty, kindness, responsibility and respect. Woodland Elementary School uses a framework of Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) to create our school culture known as the Woodland Way. It is a process which focuses on improving our school's ability to teach and support positive behavior for all students. PBIS includes school-wide methods and practices intended for all students and staff to build a positive school culture. It is a team-based process for systematic problem solving, planning, and assessment. This approach creates a safe and productive learning environment for teachers and students with few disruptions. PBIS helps students understand what is expected of them, gives teachers a framework for acknowledgement and consequences and enables administrators to use data – rather than gut reactions – to make decisions about discipline. We are excited to see where our road trip takes us!



FAMILY RESOURCE INFORMATION/OPPORTUNITIES TO DONATE

You may or may not be aware that Kimberly Area School District has two clothes closets that are located in two of our schools. One of the clothes closets is at Mapleview Intermediate (920-788-7910) and the other is at Westside Elementary (920-739-3578). If you would like to donate or are in need of some assistance with resources, you can contact Mapleview or Westside. In addition to the clothes closets, Woodland is frequently being offered ways to support our families if they should fall upon economic hardship. Please reach out to your child's teacher or school counselor if you are in need of any assistance throughout the year.



SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

If your student is going to be absent we ask that you please contact the Main Office at 730-0924 option 1 to let us know that he or she will not be present for class as soon as possible. When leaving a message, please indicate your child's name, homeroom teacher, and reason for the absence. You are able to leave a message at any time outside of our normal office hours of 7:30 AM-4:00 PM.

Wisconsin's school compulsory law requires students miss no more than ten (10) days per school year. Once a student has missed ten or more days of school, a doctor's note is required to excuse the absence. If you have questions regarding our attendance policy, please contact Tom Smits.

Dear Kimberly Area School District Families,

We are committed to promoting the social and emotional well-being of our students. By working together with United Way's PATH (Providing Access to Healing) for Students, we are now able to provide the opportunity for school-based counseling services to students in 5-year-old kindergarten through 12th grade. *New for this year - services have been expanded to be available to students younger than seventh grade. We believe this will fill an important need for some students and families.*



The United Way's PATH for Students is a partnership between United Way Fox Cities, Catalpa Health, Family Services of Northeast WI, Inc., Lutheran Social Services of Wisconsin and Upper Michigan, and the Kimberly Area School District. The purpose of this collaborative partnership is to offer mental health outreach and treatment services to the students in our schools.

Counseling is an excellent way to learn new skills, develop self-confidence, become more aware of others' views and experiences, practice new behaviors, and better understand how to deal with the problems life presents.

It is our belief that the combined commitment and expertise of our respective agencies, the knowledge and services provided to youth throughout Northeast Wisconsin, the credentialing of our programs, and the strong history of quality outcomes will allow for improved access to quality mental health services for students and families in our District.

If you are a parent and think your child may benefit, or if you are a student and feel you may benefit from counseling, you are invited to contact your school counselor for further screening.





INFORMATION FOR PARENTS



IF YOUR FAMILY LIVES IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

In a shelter



In a motel or campground due to the lack of an alternative adequate accommodation



In a car, park, abandoned building, or bus or train station



Doubled up with other people due to loss of housing or economic hardship

Your school-age children may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act.

Your eligible children have the right to:

- Receive a free, appropriate public education.
 - Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.
 - Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.
 - Enroll in the local school; or continue attending their school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is your preference.
- * If the school district believes that the school you select is not in the best interest of your children, then the district must provide you with a written explanation of its position and inform you of your right to appeal its decision.
- Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if you request this.
 - Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to your children's needs.

If you believe your children may be eligible, contact the local liaison to find out what services and supports may be available. There also may be supports available for your preschool-age children.
