Parent/Teacher Conferences



Friday, 31st is a spirit day at Woodland School and the theme is wear your pajamas or comfy clothes.




Reflections - Martin Luther King

Healthy Living 5th Grade

As your child gets older, they become more and more independent and make more and more decisions without adult assistance. While we all want to see that independent problem solving and decision making, many decisions students make now could impact the rest of their lives. It is important that 5th graders think about those consequences before making big decisions. The Kimberly Area School District uses a decision making model that encourages that thinking process. Students need to ask themselves if the decision is safe, responsible, honest, and respectful to themselves and others. They also need to consider the pros and cons of the decision. Following a decision making process will, hopefully, help 5th graders make healthier choices for the many decisions they will be making now and in the upcoming years. We used this decision making model in conjunction with our tobacco unit. With continued support from parents, and friends who are also encouraging good decisions, your child has the knowledge and refusal skills to refuse to smoke or vape.

We will be showing the Human Growth and Development video before the end of the semester. The 5th graders will view the Disney Production Straight Talk about Puberty: (Boys or Girls) in class on January 20th or 21st. Mrs. Vandenberg, the school nurse, will be showing the video to the boys and I will show the video to the girls. If you have any questions about the video or the unit objectives, please call or email.

As the semester is coming to a close so is my time with the 5th graders. Of course, I will see them a year from now during Healthy Living 6. One of the best aspects of my job is seeing how students grow (physically, mentally and socially) from one year to the next.

Music Room News

The 5th Grade students did a great job of preparing for their concert! We learned some advanced music and they rose to the challenge. Our next few weeks will be spent playing tone chimes and getting ready to play on the piano keyboards. All students will play piano keyboards during the third quarter. We will review note names and practice on the computer program Music Ace as well as Music Play to prepare. Those students who would like more time to practice note names and keyboard notes are welcome to come in at recess to work on Music Ace.

The 6th grade students are continuing to practice reading music through tone chimes. We are making beautiful sounding major chords and practicing playing rhythms and melodies. We will once again be playing keyboards soon, emphasizing more of the bass clef (left hand) than we did last year.

School choir will perform on April 7th, the same date as the band concert. We will begin rehearsing for that concert in February after the festival. 6th Grade Art

The 6th grade students are finishing their sheet metal project. The students started out their sheet metal project by searching on their chrome book for an image or logo that is an interest of theirs. The 6th grade students then drew their image onto a piece of computer paper, while drawing out their image they were sure to use rulers and stencils to make their image was very neat and clean. After their drawing was finished they taped their computer paper to a piece of sheet metal and put a book underneath the metal for cushion. The students then retraced with a pencil right over their lines on their drawing so that their image would copy onto the sheet metal. After they had their image copied onto the metal they took the computer paper off and begin to bubble the metal. The 6th grade students had to bubble up and bubble down the metal so that the metal had an example of being sunk down and popped out. The students used different shaped wood tools to push into their metal. The 6th grade students also added a texture in the background of their metal with one of the wood tools. The students then used different colored sharpies to decorate their metal with color. When the students were all finished with their metal they created a frame for the back of their metal with paper. The frame had to incorporate images, words or other things that go along with the image on their metal. The students then made a name tag and used their chrome book to fill out their check off sheet (self- assessment) on our Google classroom. The metal projects will be displayed in the hallways when they are finished.

Weeding the Library

Every year, KASD libraries go through a process of weeding books. Like weeding a garden, library weeding involves removing materials that are blocking the use and the growth of the library. Weeded titles are usually in poor condition, duplicates, out of date, not meeting the needs of the school, or simply not being read. It never means that the library doesn't value that title or author, as often times, weeded titles are replaced with newer editions or more popular options. By weeding the library, we enable students to more easily find the books they need and want, and we find areas where we can improve sections of the library's collection.



As always, Woodland's school library will be weeded this school year. Weeded materials are first offered to teachers for their classroom collections, but then we will allow students to take home materials as well. These materials will say "discard" on them and will have library labels removed or blacked out. Students are encouraged to keep these at home and include them in their personal libraries.



INFORMATION FOR PARENTS



IF YOUR FAMILY LIVES IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

In a shelter



In a motel or campground due to the lack of an alternative adequate accommodation



In a car, park, abandoned building, or bus or train station



Doubled up with other people due to loss of housing or economic hardship

Your school-age children may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act.

Your eligible children have the right to:

- Receive a free, appropriate public education.
 - Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.
 - Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.
 - Enroll in the local school; or continue attending their school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is your preference.
- * If the school district believes that the school you select is not in the best interest of your children, then the district must provide you with a written explanation of its position and inform you of your right to appeal its decision.
- Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if you request this.
 - Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to your children's needs.

If you believe your children may be eligible, contact the local liaison to find out what services and supports may be available. There also may be supports available for your preschool-age children.
