## Healthy Living

5<sup>th</sup> Grade

Healthy Living-5

As the quarter has ended, so has our unit on emotional health. The focus of the unit was on stress and anger- two emotions that can significantly negatively affect our physical, mental and social health. We learned about the cues our body gives us as reminders to calm down. We brainstormed and practiced ways to calm down and talked about consequences if our bodies are in “distress”. Feel free to remind your children about what they learned in health when you see anger or stress. (One of our most helpful strategies is to talk about it!) Awareness of the strategies and how stress and anger affect us will positively impact our health.

We will start the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter with Personal Health and Safety. As the fifth graders are becoming more independent, an adult is not always going to be right there if they are physically injured. While prevention is the most important factor in staying safe, students also need to know what to do to help themselves and others if an injury does occur. We will become familiar with basic first aid during this unit. I strongly encourage you to enroll your child in a babysitting class to help give your child more knowledge and confidence when staying home by themselves or with younger children.

Color, Form, Line, Shape, Space and Texture.







# INFORMATION FOR PARENTS



## IF YOUR FAMILY LIVES IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

In a shelter



In a motel or campground due to the lack of an alternative adequate accommodation



In a car, park, abandoned building, or bus or train station



Doubled up with other people due to loss of housing or economic hardship

*Your school-age children may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act.*

### Your eligible children have the right to:

- Receive a free, appropriate public education.
  - Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.
  - Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.
  - Enroll in the local school; or continue attending their school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is your preference.
- \* If the school district believes that the school you select is not in the best interest of your children, then the district must provide you with a written explanation of its position and inform you of your right to appeal its decision.
- Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if you request this.
  - Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to your children's needs.

*If you believe your children may be eligible, contact the local liaison to find out what services and supports may be available. There also may be supports available for your preschool-age children.*
