IMPLEMENTATION OF BUZZ-IN ENTRY SYSTEM

The Kimberly Area School District is dedicated to providing a safe environment for our students and staff. During this school year, schools will be implementing a new secure access system, commonly known as a “buzz-in entry”.

HERE'S HOW IT WORKS:

- All visitors (including family members, volunteers, and vendors are required to follow the buzz-in procedure during the school day.)
- When you arrive, press the button on the intercom. Guests may be asked to present a government issued ID to the security camera.
- A staff member may ask you some clarifying questions before granting access to the building.
- Once inside, continue to sign in at the office and wear a visitor badge while in the school.
- Anyone unfamiliar with the buzz-in procedure can refer to instructions posted at the main entrance of the school.
- We realize this system will require a change in practice from staff, families, and visitors.
- Thank you for your support as we work to create the safest learning environment possible.

Music Room News

As quarter three comes to an end, we will be wrapping up the keyboarding unit. The students have come a long way and have become much more independent piano players. The sixth grade students have really taken off in their skills. They should be very proud of their successes. Fifth grade students have made great improvements since the first few weeks also!

During the 4th quarter students of the 6th grade will learn about the elements of music, learn what to listen for in classical music, and gain an overview of music history. It is an opportunity to understand music that students don't hear every day and draw comparisons to popular music. 5th grade students will return to singing and reading music of America's folk traditions as well as other cultures.

5th Grade Art

The 5th grade students are creating a ceramic project with a theme of their choice: (animal, person, hobby...). The students began by either drawing out a sketch of their idea or searching for an image on their Chromebook. Once the 5th grade students showed Mr. Calmes their idea they grabbed the amount of clay they needed. The students then shaped their ball of clay into a 3D shape of their choice: (sphere, cube...). The students then traced an area on the top of their 3D shape with a needle tool and their pinky. The students then hollowed out their 3D clay piece with a wire tool. After the students have hollowed out their clay piece they will smooth the inside and outside with their finger and a sponge. The students then added extra clay and carved into their clay project. Their clay piece was then set out to dry and was fired. After their clay piece has been fired the first time they will then glaze their clay piece. Their clay piece is fired a second time after they have finished glazing. When the students are all finished with their clay project they will fill out a name tag. After they are finished with their name tag they will use their chrome book to fill out their check off sheet (self-assessment) on our Google classroom. The clay projects will be displayed in the display cases when they are finished.

Color, Line, Form, Shape and Texture.

2019 Badger State Spelling Bee




You may or may not be aware that the Kimberly Area School District has two clothes closets that are located in two of our schools. One of the clothes closets is at Maplevue Intermediate (920-788-7910) and the other is at Westside Elementary (920-739-3578). If you would like to donate or are in need of some assistance with resources, you can contact Maplevue or Westside. In addition to the clothes, Woodland is frequently being offered ways to support our families if they should fall upon economic hardship. Please reach out to your child's teacher or school counselor if you are in need of any assistance throughout the year.



When to Keep Your Child Home

Children should be kept home from school when they don't feel well. It is important to get the rest they need to recover, and to prevent the spread of germs to other children and the staff. If you are unsure of when to keep your child home, please contact the school nurse or your family medical provider.

The following symptoms may suggest a communicable disease. Children who have the following symptoms should be kept home from school until a doctor has seen them, they no longer have symptoms indicating a communicable disease or they have received treatment for at least 24 hours for certain diseases.



FEVER

An oral temperature of 100.4 or higher indicates a fever. If your child has a temp of 100.4 or higher at school he/she will be sent home. Your child must be fever free for 24 hours without the use of a fever reducer (Tylenol or Ibuprofen product) before he/she returns to school.




SORE THROAT

If a fever is accompanied by a sore throat, stomach ache or head ache it may be strep throat. Strep throat is diagnosed by a throat culture obtained at a medical clinic. If your child is diagnosed with strep throat, your child must be on appropriate antibiotics for 24 hours and fever free for 24 hours without the use of a fever reducer (Tylenol or Ibuprofen product) before he/she returns to school.




VOMITING/DIARRHEA

If your child has an episode of vomiting and diarrhea at school, he/she will be sent home. Anyone with these symptoms should stay home until symptoms are absent for 24 hours.



COUGH

A cough may be a sign of many different illnesses. If a cough is accompanied by a fever, sore throat, body aches or any other symptoms you should keep your child home. Any cough that lasts for more than several days should be discussed with a doctor.



SKIN LESIONS/SORES


Rashes and infected sores needed to be diagnosed by a medical provider. Many skin rashes such as impetigo, scabies, chicken pox, Fifth disease or Hand Foot and Mouth disease are very contagious. Students may return to school once the rash has been diagnosed and treated for 24 hours or cleared by a doctor. Open sores from illnesses such as chicken pox and impetigo may need to be covered at school with bandages for several days.



OTHER

Symptoms that prevent the student from active participation in usual school activities OR student is requiring more care than school that can safely provide.

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS



IF YOUR FAMILY LIVES IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

In a shelter



In a motel or campground due to the lack of an alternative adequate accommodation



In a car, park, abandoned building, or bus or train station



Doubled up with other people due to loss of housing or economic hardship

Your school-age children may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act.

Your eligible children have the right to:

- Receive a free, appropriate public education.
 - Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.
 - Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.
 - Enroll in the local school; or continue attending their school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is your preference.
- * If the school district believes that the school you select is not in the best interest of your children, then the district must provide you with a written explanation of its position and inform you of your right to appeal its decision.
- Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if you request this.
 - Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to your children's needs.

If you believe your children may be eligible, contact the local liaison to find out what services and supports may be available. There also may be supports available for your preschool-age children.
